Jacob's birth was located in Cheshire. The registration District Nantwich, in the Sub-district of Wybunbury in the County of Chester. Wybunbury and Monks Coppenhall now come under Crewe. Where Crewe is now was originally called Monks Coppenhall. Crewe was established when the Grand Junction Railway came to the area in 1837.

Jacob Alfred Hastings was a stoker at the time of the marriage. A stoker was someone who tended and fed coal to boilers in mills and ships. Ellen Adams' father was a porter. A porter was a door or gate keeper, or, someone who carried baggage in railway stations and other public places. Jacob and Ellen both resided at 172 Cleveland Street.

Over the course of their marriage, Jacob and Ellen had several daughters (at least).

Jacob died in 1906 in Tranmere Union Infirmary of pulmonary tuberculosis. His occupation is listed as Fireman, Steam Vessel of Birkenhead. He was buried in a public grave at Flaybrick Hill Cemetery, Birkenhead. His wife, Ellen, was still alive at the time of his death. He was buried at Flaybrick Hill Cemetery on March 31, 1906. Public Grave Section 7 Grave 476_
